Style & Spirit celebrates the inspiring creativity of American couturier Chester Weinberg (1930–1985). At the height of his career Weinberg was held in the same esteem as Geoffrey Beene, Donald Brooks, and Oscar de la Renta. This exhibition reintroduces Weinberg's stylish and spirited creations to audiences in Australia for the first time.

In this glamorous celebration of fashion, more than 50 of Weinberg's best creations from the 1950s to 1980s are displayed alongside pieces by his contemporaries Cristóbal Balenciaga, Christian Dior, Pierre Cardin, and André Courrèges.



### **CANINE TIDBITS**





Dr Robert Harland, the SIDA Foundation and The David Roche Foundation Research Fellow hosted by the UniSA, from Loughborough University in the United Kingdom, is in Adelaide pursuing his interest in toponymy, topophilia, and design. He has been delving into the archive at TDRF to identify the 'graphic heritage' associated with David Roche that may be utilised as a creative resource to enhance David Roche Park, the headquarters of Dogs SA.

As well as David's involvement in the many events hosted at the park, David also played an unacknowledged role in establishing it as one of the best designed venues for dog shows. Robert's research asks the question 'what can we expect to learn about someone from a place named after them?' It is hoped his research will provide opportunity to imagine how David might be commemorated at the park named after him, in ways that live up to his highly developed design sensibility.

For the hundreds of people who attend events and activities at the park, there is the possibility to learn so much more about the design culture that bridges the private and public parts of David's persona. This

may take the form of impermanent, semi-permanent, and permanent public art and design interventions for the visiting public both during and in between the many activities facilitated by Dogs SA, for the local as well as international visitors involved with the canine community.

## **TODAY'S TREASURE**

While visiting Ireland in 2003, David Roche acquired this unusual urn-form vase from Gerald Keynon Antiques and Fine Art. Inscribed on the underside 'Donovan's Irish Manufacture', the vase was sold around 1800–05 by Dublin-based glass and china merchants James and George Donovan. The Donovans' established their firm in 1770 at 23 George's Quay, premises also used by their father (also James), a hoop maker, and operated until 1829.

Donovans sold wares from a variety of porcelain manufacturers in Staffordshire, including Copeland, Minton, and Spode, and Shropshire-based Coalport. Though the manufacturer of this porcelain vase remains unknown, it is handsomely decorated with a canary yellow ground and painted detail that conveys a former owner's political position.

The waisted neck of the vase depicts antique Irish crowns and harps encircled by flowers. Beneath this, richly-coloured flowers distract the viewer from nine snakes - symbolic of revolution - curled over a trellis. The lower portion of the vase depicts a cláirseach (Irish harp) between garlands of flowers carried by birds and the vase's plinth features the phrase 'Erin go Brah' (Ireland Forever), two symbols used by the United Irishmen around 1800.



At the time this vase was created, Ireland was in the grips of political turbulence punctuated by uprisings in 1798 and 1803. This remarkable survivor is a significant example of how nationalists would use decorative arts to (in) discreetly convey their sentiments to audiences privileged to enter their homes.




